

LGBT Leadership Scholarships

Women in Medicine (WIM) will present four \$5,000 Leadership Scholarships for LGBT female medical students enrolled in allopathic or osteopathic medical schools in the United States or Canada this year. The application and guidelines are located on the WIM website, WomenInMedicine.org, and is due April 15, 2014. The scholarships will be presented at the WIM annual meeting in Ogunquit, Maine, with the expectation that the medical students will be present to receive their awards. Applicants should be in good academic standing, and have actively contributed/demonstrated leadership for the LGBT community.

Conference Scholarships

Medical students are encouraged to attend WIM for many reasons. Not only is the medical education relevant, but the network of personal and professional support at WIM is also an invaluable investment in a student's education, career and personal growth. WIM invites medical students to apply for scholarships to help defray the cost of attending this conference. The deadline for conference support is June 1, 2014.

Transportation

Logan International Airport, MA - Distance: approximately 70 miles - Route 95 North. Cross Piscataqua Bridge into Maine, to York/Ogunquit Exit 7. North on Route 1 for 3.3 miles. Right on River Road for 1/2 mile, bear left on Old County Road. Left on Shore Road for approximately 3 miles.

Portland International Airport, ME - Distance: approximately 40 miles - Maine Turnpike South to Wells Exit 19. Left after toll booth onto Route 109 to Route 1 South to Ogunquit. At center of town, bear left on Shore Road for approximately 3 miles.

Manchester Airport, NH - Distance: approximately 60 miles - Route 95 North. Cross Piscataqua Bridge into Maine, to York/Ogunquit Exit 7. North on Route 1 for 3.3 miles. Right on River Road for 1/2 mile, bear left on Old County Road. Left on Shore Road for approximately 3 miles.

Amtrak from Boston to Wells - Taking the North Station Maine Service to Wells is approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes. From there you can take the shuttle directly to the Cliff House.

Area Information & Leisure Time

For those of you familiar with New England, you are well aware of Ogunquit's natural beauty, as well as its reputation as the other gay mecca in New England. Ogunquit is only about an hour drive from Boston and is easily accessible from Logan Airport, Manchester, NH or Portland, Maine. The town is famous for its wonderful shopping, magnificent beach and the cliff walk that runs along 1 1/2 miles of ocean. There are many options for recreational and cultural activities in the vicinity. These include hiking, amusement parks, wildlife preserves, whale watches, kayaking, fishing and let's not forget LL Bean and the outlet shopping.

Significant Other/Kids Trip to Funtown/Splashtown – If there is sufficient interest (and we hope there will be), we will offer a family outing to Funtown/Splashtown during the first day of the conference. A Women's Health Symposium

Women in Medicine 2014 marks the 31st annual retreat and CME conference for lesbian and other sexual minority female physicians, medical students and their partners. The yearly conference is a forum for discussion of front-line research on women's health issues, as well as lesbian, bisexual, gender-queer and transgender women's issues. There also are non-medical seminars of interest to all, as well as rejuvenating social opportunities for children and adults alike. Essential networking and mentoring opportunities abound, with a special focus on the needs of medical students and residents. This is the only medical conference where partners are not only invited to attend, but are also welcomed and encouraged to participate and learn from the high quality medical and non-CME presentations. We are proud to present a broad range of medical, ethical and social issues relevant to today's world.

In keeping with the retreat format, only registered physicians and their registered partners are invited to attend the conference. Children are invited to social functions as deemed appropriate.

Course Description

However, topics vary across a broad range of medical specialties, and are appropriate for both generalists and specialists. Educational Objectives

By the end of the event, participants should be able to:

1. Recognize the current state of medical education in relation to the treatment of LGBT patients and identify opportunities to improve it, thereby decreasing health care disparities.
2. Describe current laws and regulations mandating access for patients with disabilities including upcoming standards for equipment, as defined by the US Access Board and the Department of Justice.
3. Formulate strategies for dealing with opiate addicted patients and integrate a comprehensive approach to optimize the patient's chances for health and recovery.
4. Discuss the role hospice care will play in patients quality of life.
