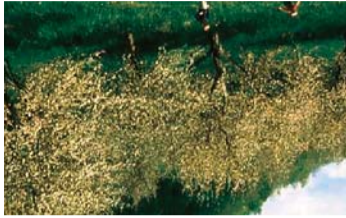

Hotel Information

The Radisson Hotel Burlington overlooks beautiful Lake Champlain and the Adirondack Mountains, and is within walking distance of the Church Street Marketplace, Waterfront Park and the Lake Champlain Ferry. The hotel features two dining experiences - lakefront views and superb cuisine in Seasons on the Lake or more casual fare in The Oak Street Café. An indoor heated pool, whirlpool spa and fitness center are located on property.



A block of rooms with reduced rates has been reserved for conference registrants at the Radisson. Please make your hotel reservations directly with the hotel (802-658-6500) prior to June 10th and indicate your participation in the Women in Medicine conference to receive special rates (\$134 single; \$144 double occupancy per room, per night). Rates apply two days before and after the conference dates. Space is limited during this busy summer season, so please reserve early.

Transportation

The Burlington International Airport is served by several major airlines. Auto rentals are available at the airport, but should be reserved in advance. Hotel van service is available upon request.

Burlington is an easy 3-hour drive from Manchester, NH, 4-hour drive from Boston, just 1 1/2 hours from Montreal, and 6 hours from New York City.

Area Information

Ideally situated on the shores of Lake Champlain - the sixth largest freshwater lake in the U.S. - Burlington offers an abundance of entertainment and recreational opportunities. Favorite attractions are the famous Shelburne Museum (45 acres of American Folk art), a cruise aboard the Spirit of Ethan Allen, the Vermont Teddy Bear Factory, and the Church Street Marketplace - an open air market with old world style featuring boutiques, cafes and providing a shopper's paradise.



The Burlington Community Boathouse, a short walk from the hotel, has bicycles and boats for rent. A bike path spans several miles of the lake's shore. Swimming beaches, public parks, golf courses and tennis courts are accessible by cab or car.

A sampling of Vermont's own products like maple syrup, Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream and Lake Champlain Chocolates can be enjoyed throughout the area.

Child Care

Families with children are an important element of the WIM conference. Recreational opportunities in and around Burlington make this conference the ideal place for children. As always, professional childcare providers will operate a WIM Daycare Center while the conference is in session. Children from 6 months to 12 years are eligible to participate in this program offering age appropriate interactive educational opportunities, arts and crafts, and play. Evening child care will also be available. If you wish to receive child care information, please check the appropriate box on the conference registration form. Fees for child care are extra and require early and separate registration from the conference. Depending on interest, activities for older children may also be arranged.

Leisure Time & Tours

The conference is designed to provide participants with two free afternoons for enjoying the recreational activities within walking distance of the hotel or for exploring the surrounding countryside. Within an hour's drive of the city is the quaint village of Stowe, home of Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream, the Stowe Alpine Slide, and the Trapp Family Lodge (founded by the von Trapp's of *Sound of Music* fame). Three auto/passenger ferries operate across Lake Champlain, providing a pleasant respite and picturesque views of the Adirondacks. Access to a multitude of hiking and biking trails as well as small rivers and streams for canoeing, kayaking and fishing can be found throughout the area. The fabulous city of Montreal is an easy 1 1/2 hour drive to the north. You may wish to seek out these activities on your own, or participate in an organized tour. Depending on interest, scheduled tours will be arranged as follows:



Preconference Tour to Montreal - Full Day - Tuesday, July 9th ~ \$69
Includes city tour to Notre Dame Cathedral, Olympic Park, "Old Montreal", Lunch, Free Time.

Stowe Village Tour - Half Day - Friday, July 12th ~ \$43
Includes visit to Cold Hollow Cider Mill, Gondola Ride at Stowe Mountain Resort, Trapp Family Gift Shop and Ben & Jerry's Ice Cream Factory.

Guided Canoeing - Winooski River - Half Day - Friday, July 12th ~ \$70
River canoeing with experienced guide. Mild rapids or quiet waters. Includes lunch.

Guided Hiking Tour - Stowe Area - Half Day - Saturday, July 13th ~ \$75
Moderate hiking tour with experienced guide. Includes lunch.

Shelburne Farms/Vermont Teddy Bear Factory - Half Day - Saturday, July 13th ~ \$40
Shelburne Farms is a 1,400 acre working farm. The tour features the Children's Farmyard, open-air wagon ride and a visit to the Farm Store. The Vermont Teddy Bear Factory is home to Vermont's own handcrafted, jointed teddy bears. Experience a magical world and see how each unique bear is created.

Postconference Tour of Shelburne Museum - Full Day - Sunday, July 14th ~ \$45
Vast collections of fine art, folk sculpture, weathervanes, quilts, toys, dolls, circus memorabilia and more contained in 37 historic buildings. The steamboat "Ticonderoga," moved overland to the museum, was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1963.

Special Events

Opening Banquet - This complimentary event represents a special beginning to the conference. Through informal introductions, it provides an opportunity for all participants to get to know each other, develop relationships and fosters continued personal and professional networking.

Small Groups - These sessions offer physicians and partners an intimate environment for in-depth, sometimes emotional and soul-searching, discussions on a variety of personal issues. This is a great venue for getting to know your colleagues in a smaller, more personal, setting than a lecture. Don't miss them!

LHF Reception - The annual reception is a fun-filled fund-raising event which enables the continued financial support for lesbian health projects.

Lake Champlain Dinner Cruise - Join us aboard the Spirit of Ethan Allen for a complimentary 3 1/2 hour dinner cruise along the shores of Lake Champlain. Enjoy a delectable buffet dinner, glorious views of the sunset over the Adirondack Mountains and dancing to the tunes of DJ "Mary V."



Barbecue at Oak Ledge Park - This complimentary activity will be our closing event. Join friends and colleagues in an informal setting on the beach - a time to relax and unwind or have a friendly game of volleyball!
