# A Women's Health Symposium

Women in Medicine 2004 will be the 21st annual retreat and CME conference for lesbian physicians. This unique continuing medical education conference is designed by and for lesbian physicians, medical students and their partners. This gathering is a blend of education, camaraderie, networking and mentoring. The program format includes general sessions and breakouts incorporating up-to-date information on women's health issues, lesbian health research and other pertinent medical topics. Breakout sessions for non-physician partners will also be conducted. This is the only medical conference where partners are not only invited to attend, but are welcomed and encouraged to participate and learn from the high quality medical and non-CME presentations. We are proud to present a broad range of medical, personal and social issues relevant to today's world.

In keeping with the retreat format, only registered physicians and their registered partners are invited to attend the educational sessions and evening social functions associated with the program. Children are invited to social functions as appropriate.

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

### Accommodations

This year's conference returns to Cape Cod - the Provincetown Inn in Provincetown, Massachusetts. The Inn is a 100 room resort surrounded by water on three sides, located at the tip of the Cape. This charming retreat offers a private beach and outdoor pool on property. Cape Cod National Seashore, adjacent to the Inn, brings the natural beauty of its beaches, dunes and woodlands, right to your door. Whale watching, fishing, tennis and golf are just minutes away via Provincetown's summer shuttle bus.

A block of rooms has been reserved for WIM conference registrants at the Provincetown Inn. Upon registration for the conference, a Housing Form will be sent to you. You may use this form or telephone the

Inn directly (800-942-5388 or 508-497-9500) to make your room reservations. Room rates include three meals per day (full-course, fixed menu). Special dietary needs should be communicated to the Inn directly. Space at the Inn is limited; please make your housing arrangements (and register for the conference) early. Rooms cannot be guaranteed after April 30th. If you are a registered participant staying off property, but wish to dine with the group, you may purchase a meal ticket package. Please indicate on the conference registration form if you are interested in this package.

## Travel/Transportation

Provincetown is located at the end of Route 6, the main route upon entering the Cape. Driving time from Boston (MA) or Providence (RI) is approximately 2 ½ hours; from New York City, about 7 hours. Regular bus service is available from these cities with travel time slightly longer than driving.


Cape Air flies from Boston's Logan Airport direct to Provincetown Airport. The scenic flight takes approximately 25 minutes.

Passenger ferry service from Boston is available in season through Bay State Cruise Co., Inc. (617-748-1428) or Boston Harbor Cruises (877-733-9425).

### **Child Care**

Families with children are an important element of the WIM conference. Recreational opportunities around Cape Cod make this conference

the ideal place for children. As always, professional childcare providers will operate a WIM Daycare Center while the conference is in session.
Children from 6 months to 12 years are eligible to participate in this program offering age appropriate interactive educational opportunities, arts and crafts, and play. Evening child care will also be available.



If there is adequate interest, COLAGE (Children of Lesbians and Gays Everywhere) will present a program for teens, featuring workshops and recreation.

COLAGE leaders are young adults who grew up in lesbian or gay parent families. If you wish to receive child care or COLAGE information, please check the appropriate box on the conference registration form. Fees for these programs are extra and require early and separate registration from the conference.

### Weather

The Cape weather in late June is variable with day time temperatures averaging anywhere from 65 to 75 degrees. Dressing in layers is a good idea when

light to medium weight clothing is recommended - always bring along a sweater or light jacket for summer evenings.



Provincetown is a diverse, cosmopolitan community which welcomes visitors with open arms. Whether your interests are cultural, historical, ecological or recreational, they will be satisfied in this beautiful coastal haven. Nestled in its winding streets are 18th and 19th century homes, art galleries, boutiques and a myriad of restaurants - from hotdog stands to gourmet cuisine. Night time is alive with clubs, summer cabarets and theatre performances. The conference is designed to provide participants with two free afternoons for enjoying recreational activities within walking distance or for exploring the surrounding area. You may wish to arrive early to participate in the Annual Portuguese Festival (June 24-27), culminating in the Blessing of the Fleet on Sunday, June 27th.

Leisure time opportunities abound on the Cape. Provincetown is the site of the Pilgrams' first landing. The Pilgram Monument and Museum commemorates the signing of the Mayflower compact and features a descriptive history of Provincetown.

Whales played in important part in Provincetown's economy in the 19th century. Continue the tradition by joining a whale watching expedition to observe fin and humpback whales in their natural habitat.

Provincetown boasts an important and dynamic environment for art in all its manifestations. The works of artists, past and present, are displayed extensively throughout town. Biking, hiking, kayaking and fishing provide additional adventures to be enjoyed outside of the educational experience.

#### Special Events (For Registered Participants)

**Opening Banquet** - This complimentary Sunday evening event for registered participants represents a special beginning to the conference. Through informal introductions, it provides an opportunity for all participants to get to know each other, develop relationships and foster continued personal and professional networking.

Small Groups - Throughout the conference, these sessions offer physicians and partners an intimate environment for in-depth, sometimes emotional and soul-searching, discussions on a variety of personal issues. This is a great venue for getting to know your colleagues in a smaller, more personal setting than a lecture. Don't miss them!

**Film Festival** - Join us after dinner on Monday for a night at the movies - an evening of fun and entertainment. Refreshments will be served. Children are welcome.

**Special Event** - This special evening for registered participants is designed to provide both reflection and celebration. Following dinner, we will host "Graduations and Transitions" - a special event to recognize the achievements of students and residents and our colleagues. To conclude the evening, we are extremely pleased to announce that Kate Clinton will perform for us. Kate is a nationally recognized political humorist and family entertainer who believes that humor gets us through peacetime, wartime and scoundreltime.

LHF Reception and Auction - The annual reception and auction on Wednesday evening, prior to dinner, is a fun-filled fund-raising event which enables the continued financial support for lesbian health projects. Entertainment will follow dinner - a perfect way to punctuate the WIM experience.

Post-Conference Biking Trip - A biking trip will begin on Thursday, July 1 and continue through the July 4th weekend. After moving to mid-cape, about 1/2 hour from Provincetown, several short (15-20 miles) bike rides will take riders in various directions.
