Weather

Accommodations

Transportation

Area Information & Leisure Time

The Squaw Valley/Lake Tahoe region offers a diverse range of activities as the area transforms from a winter wonderland to springtime meadows of vibrant wildflowers. Hailed as "The Most Beautiful Drive in America," the Lake Tahoe Basin has many natural and man-made wonders within its borders. A pleasant 72-mile mountain drive around the lake affords breathtaking views, fascinating side trips and historical points of interest. Whether active or passive, the main attraction of this incredible area continues to be the quiet beauty of the Sierra and the timeless inspiration of the lake itself.

Easy and affordable bus service is available to Tahoe City and a free shuttle from the Resort to the adjacent Village at Squaw Valley provides for unique shopping and sight-seeing experiences. Originating at the Resort, a spectacular six mile bike path to Tahoe City meanders along the Truckee River. Hiking, kayaking, white water rafting, fly fishing and horseback riding round out the recreational possibilities in the area.

Each morning of the conference, a Sunrise Yoga class will be conducted from 6:30 to 7:15. This invigorating yoga practice utilizes Ashtanga, Iyengar and Anusara methods. Class size is limited to 20 participants. The cost is \$20 per person, payable at the time of the class.

A guided hike of Shirley Canyon will take place on Saturday afternoon from 1:30 to 5:30 (total duration including transportation). The trail begins at the base of Squaw Valley and climbs 2,000 feet to Shirley Lake. Transportation to and from the trailhead, water and energy bars are included. All ages are welcome to participate in this intermediate level hike. The cost is \$30 per person, payable at the time of the hike. Please indicate your interest on the registration form.

A Women's Health Symposium

Women in Medicine 2010 marks the 27th annual retreat and CME conference for lesbian physicians, medical students and their partners. This annual gathering is a blend of education, camaraderie, networking and mentoring. The educational program is designed to address up-to-date information on a variety of pertinent medical topics related to women's health issues and lesbian health research. Breakout sessions for non-physician partners will also be conducted. This is the only medical conference where partners are not only invited to attend, but are also welcomed and encouraged to participate and learn from the high quality medical and non-CME presentations. We are proud to present a broad range of medical, ethical, and social issues relevant to today's world.

In keeping with the retreat format, only registered physicians and their registered partners are invited to attend the conference. Children are invited to social functions as appropriate.

Course Description

This event is open to all lesbian physicians and their partners. It is intended to be a multidisciplinary review of women's health, with a specific emphasis on lesbian health. Topics vary across a broad range of medical specialties, and are appropriate for both generalists and specialists. Speakers include nationally and internationally known experts in their respective fields.

Educational Objectives

Our Educational Objectives include:

1. Become familiar with emerging research and best practices in lesbian health.
2. Discuss the clinical and ethical implications of the use of stem cells to treat a variety of diagnoses.
3. Understand the potential environmental impacts on reproductive health.
4. Learn how to use statins in a clinical setting.
5. Learn how to incorporate an early workup for autism into clinical practice.
6. Understand the epidemiology, evaluation, and diagnosis of skin cancer.

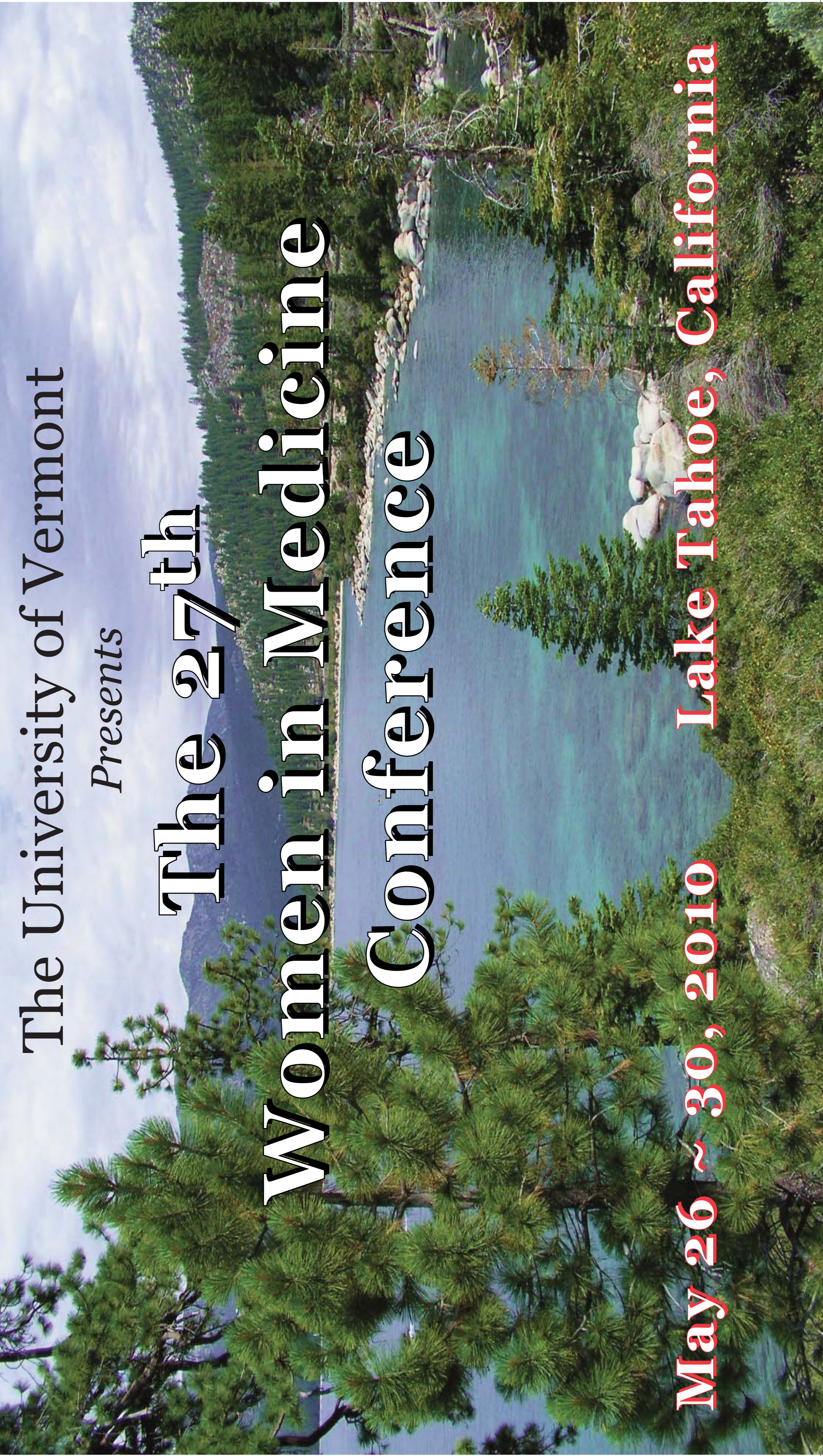
