

Average daytime temperatures in late July are generally 76 to 80 with lows in the evening between 60 to 70 degrees. While July is typically a warm and sunny month in Vermont, it is always advisable to be prepared with a sweater or light jacket for the occasional cool evening.

#### **Area Information/Leisure Time**

Ideally situated on the shores of Lake Champlain - the sixth largest freshwater lake in the U.S. – Burlington offers an abundance of entertainment and recreational opportunities. 
